COMMUNITY

The communities of Hawcreek and Flat Rock townships are located in the northeast corner of Bartholomew County, Indiana. Both communities are rural and primarily agricultural in nature. The high school is located on Indiana State Road 9 on the south side of Hope, ten miles northeast of Columbus and seventeen miles south of Shelbyville. The community has a stable, small-town atmosphere and is very supportive of the school and the school activities.

SCHOOL

Hauser Junior-Senior High School serves approximately 440 students in grades 7-12 and has an enrollment of approximately 285 students in the high school. Hauser is accredited by the Indiana Department of Education.

Hauser has a professional teaching staff of 27, with a pupil to teacher ratio of 16 to 1. Hauser is affiliated with the Columbus Area Career Connection (C4) and the Special Services of Johnson County and Surrounding Schools. These affiliations provide opportunities for vocational/career education and school-to-work options as well as services for students with special needs. Hauser High School also has articulation/dual credit agreements with Ivy Tech Community College, IUPUC, and Indiana University so that students may earn college credits while in high school.

SCHOLASTIC RECOGNITION

Academic Letter – Four consecutive semesters with a GPA of 3.5 or higher and no grade lower than a C

Honor Roll – GPA of 3.2 or higher with no grade lower than a C-

Core 40 Diploma – 40 credits as defined by the Indiana Department of Education

Core 40 w/ Technical Honors Diploma – 47 credits as defined by the Indiana Department of Education with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, no grade less than a C-, and 2 additional requirements

Core 40 w/Academic Honors Diploma – 47 credits as defined by the Indiana Department of Education with a minimum of a 3.0 GPA, no grade lower than a C-, and 3 additional requirements

CLASS RANK

All grades are weighted equally which are included in class rank. Points for the letter grade are multiplied by the number of credits earned in that class and added to get a total of points earned. This number is then divided by the number of credits attempted to achieve the grade point average. A cumulative grade point average begins whenever the student begins taking high school courses for credit. Currently, advanced-level students may begin earning high school credits while in eighth grade. The cumulative grade point average is used to rank students from the highest to the lowest grade point average in the cohort class. Students receive one credit per semester with the following exceptions: *Columbus Area Career Connection classes* earn 2 to 4 credits per semester.

POST SECONDARY EDUCATION

For the Class of 2017, 48% have pursued 4-year degrees, 12% have pursued 2-year degrees, 28% have joined the workforce, and 12% have joined the military.

SCHOLASTIC HONORS

Since 2001, Hauser has had two National Merit Scholars and four Commended Scholars.

ATHLETICS

Hauser High School is a member of the Mid-Hoosier Conference. The school has a long history of outstanding athletic accomplishments. The 2005 Baseball team was Class A State Runner-up. In 2006, Hauser was the Class A Boy's Basketball State Champions. Most recently, the 2015 Girl's Softball team was Class A State Champions, and the 2017 Volleyball team was Class A State Runner-up.
